Virtual vs. In person: one size fits all?


- Most residents prefer virtual didactic lectures
- Most faculty prefer in-person didactic lectures
- Both residents and faculty prefer in person case readouts at the PACS station
- Preferences for society meetings?
 - \rightarrow Most prefer 50% virtual and 50% in person

Virtual Learning: is it effective?

- Tricky question: subjective increase in confidence and knowledge
- Lack benchmark, focus on result after intervention



Langone

- Student general impression
 lower for virtual than in person
- Exam grades were better in virtual cohort compared to in person cohort

Virtual vs. In person: are we oversimplifying?

- Focus on quality of the education: high quality virtual better than horrible in person and viceversa
- Most proven educational methods can be applied both virtually and in person
 - Audience participation/polling systems
 - Heutagogical didactic approaches (inverted classroom)


Take home
